We were very proud to have met our ISAT ELA goal this year. We are back on track with pre-COVID results with 100% of our students proficient. In addition, 67% of the class scored at an ADVANCED level and 33% scored PROFICIENT.

MMACHS increased participation in the ISU Associate of Science in Health Science (ASHS) Degree pathway last year and is hoping to continue this trend. Students in all grades have the opportunity to attend annual college and career field trips to explore Idaho's own industry and postsecondary options. Juniors complete at least two job shadows over the course of the year in an effort to plan their futures with confidence. These job shadows frequently help students identify which capstone pathway they wish to pursue, which then encourages seniors to continue their postsecondary education. MMACHS' students have demonstrated a 100% pass rate on the Workplace Readiness Exam for the last several years and continue to enjoy a 100% certification rate in our Certified Nursing Assisting pathway.

MMACHS has added Pharmacy Technician to our capstone pathway options and hopes to have at least 50% of students achieve certification by passing the PTCB exam this year. Senior projects presentations are returning to appropriate community audiences so that current research and information may be shared. We continue to to place high importance on getting our PSAT and SAT scores to the level they were pre-COVID. We have documented some improvement, but are working to meet our lofty goals.
