



- <u>Course Objectives</u>: Upon completion of two years of Health Occupations at MMACHS, students will have sufficient knowledge of, and be able to:
 - Identify the roles and educational/credentialing requirements of various health care practitioners.
 - Discuss the United States health care delivery system, including principles of health care and law and ethics
 - Identify and define commonly used medical terms and abbreviations
 - Complete a unit of instruction on blood borne pathogens and Universal Precautions
 - Identify the interrelationship between agent, host and environment in health and illness
 - Identify methods to enforce worksite safety in health care environments

- Demonstrate methods of communication that improve interpersonal relations as applied to patients, peers, supervisors, and other allied health team members
- Complete CPR and first aid training
- Complete a unit on sexual Reproduction, birth and delivery, sexually transmitted illnesses and contraception

• Student Expectations

- Come to class prepared. Note cards are required (350), writing utensils, and textbooks
- Students are expected to take notes, be prepared for classroom discussions.
- Participate fully in class activities and discussions.
- Make arrangements with Ms. Ascuena should you need extra time for any assignment absent or not.

• Cheating includes, but is not limited to:

- Obtaining, providing, or using unauthorized materials or devices for an examination or assignment, whether verbally, visually, electronically, or by notes, books, or other means.

- Removing the test instrument or test information from the testing room or other location without the instructor's explicit permission.
- Assisting another student without the instructor's permission.
- Deceiving instructors or other university officials about academic work.
- Altering grades on one's own or another student's work.
