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EXPECTATIONS

Be safe, be respectful, and be responsible. When given time to work in class, each student needs to be working on math. Each student needs to be in the classroom and ready to learn when class time begins.

MATERIALS

3-ring binder (can be shared with other classes)

paper for taking notes

pencil (or blue/black pen)

highlighter

scientific calculator (a few will be available in the classroom if needed)

BINDERS

Keeping organized is an important life skill. For this class you need a three-ring binder (which can be shared with another class). Math papers should be kept for the whole semester.

CALCULATORS

A scientific calculator is required for success in high school mathematics classes. Preferred scientific calculator examples are Texas Instruments 30xa, TI-30x, or similar.

ASSIGNMENTS

Practice assignments are assigned every class day. Keep up with the assignments, ask questions in class, follow along with the teacher in class, and work in class when given time to work. All classwork and practice assignments should be completed to the best of the student's ability with work and a complete solution shown for each problem. Assignments are discussed in class and students are expected to make corrections or additions to their work at that time. Assignments will be handed in as packets every quiz and/or test day. Grades on the practice assignments will be based on completion and showing of the student's thought process.

QUIZZES

Quizzes will be given one to three times during each unit/module. A student's own notes and assignments are allowed to be used on quizzes. Quizzes may be on paper, through Schoology, or possibly other digital means as necessary. Quizzes can be retaken once, earning a maximum grade of 70%, and within a week of the class getting the quizzes returned. Those deadlines will be posted in Schoology and in the classroom.

TESTS

Tests will be given at the end of each module, and in some cases there may also be a mid-module test. One 3" by 5" notecard of notes or examples is allowed to be used on each test, and will be handed in stapled to the test. Students are able to retake each test once, only after coming in for extra assistance, earning a maximum grade of 70%, and within a week of the class getting the tests returned. Those deadlines will be posted in Schoology and in the classroom. There will be a semester exam assessing learning from that semester in December and in May.

GRADING

PowerSchool is the official gradebook. Be sure to check PowerSchool regularly. All final grades will be rounded to the traditional rounding methods utilized in PowerSchool.

RESTROOMS AND HALL PASSES

EXTRA HELP

For extra help outside of class time, come into the portable classroom during Study Hall, before school, or after school on A Days only. I am a part-time teacher and work only on A Days.

ABSENT / MAKE-UP WORK

When a student is absent, they are responsible for getting their own work that was missed. Schoology will be the best resources for our calendar and assignments. Common Curriculum will also be used for links. There is a crate in the back of the classroom that a student should check for possible missing papers. Any quizzes or tests missed is the student's responsibility to makeup. As is MMACHS policy, a student has an additional two school days for each day absent to turn in assignments, make up quizzes, or make up tests.

LATE WORK

Late work will be accepted only when the student communicates to the teacher beforehand. Respect deadlines.

DISCIPLINARY CONSEQUENCES
