GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the State of Idaho's graduation requirements, students at MMACHS are required to complete the following: four years of math, four years of science, one semester of certification classes (EMT, CNA, Pharmacy Tech, or Medical Office), one semester of a medical internship, two years of Spanish, two years of Health & Wellness, 2 years of Health Occupations, three years of Technology, one semester each of Psychology and Law & Ethics.
